3 Sufficient and Ancillary Statistics

Consider a sample $(X_1, Y_1), (X_2, Y_2), \dots, (X_n, Y_n)$ drawn from the bivariate distribution

$$f(x, y; \theta) = \exp\left(-\theta x - \frac{y}{\theta}\right) \quad 0 < x < \infty, \quad 0 < y < \infty \quad (3.1)$$

where $0 < \theta < \infty$.

- (a) Show that $V = \sum_{i=1}^n X_i$ and $W = \sum_{i=1}^n Y_i$ are joint sufficient statistics for θ .
- (b) Show that $T = \sqrt{W/V}$ is the maximum likelihood estimator for θ .
- (c) Show that $U = \sqrt{VW}$ is an ancillary statistic for θ .
- (d) Show that T is *not* a sufficient statistic for θ .
- (e) Explain why this means T and U (or V and W) are the minimal sufficient statistics for θ .
